

Making Alerts Actionable and Understandable: Moving to Plain Language and Streamlining Warning Updates

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NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE HAZARD SIMPLIFICATION PROJECT (HazSimp)

The NWS has made the decision to replace "Advisory" and "Special Weather Statement" terminology from the Watch, Warning, and Advisory (WWA) system with **plain language headlines**.

WHY IS THIS BEING CHANGED?

According to social science, the term Advisory is especially confusing.



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"Is this as bad as a Warning?"
"Is this a downgrade from a Watch?"
"What are you advising me to do?"

One goal of HazSimp is to convey plain language in NWS displays without adding a third term.


WHAT WILL THIS LOOK LIKE?

New text headlines led by the HAZARD NAME:

SNOW: Hazardous travel in snow and blowing snow from 9am to 8pm

HEAT: Heat index values up to 100F until 4pm

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Haz Simp: Consolidation and Reformatting

Product Consolidation

Product Reformatting

Winter

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- Three Winter Weather Advisories to one
- Three Winter Storm Watches to one

<u>Marine</u>

• Four Small Craft Advisories to one

Flood

- Five Flood Advisories to one
- In most cases, Flash Flood Watch and Flood Watch consolidated to Flood Watch

Non-Precipitation

- Wind Chill product suite consolidated with Extreme Cold product suite
- Excessive Heat Watch and Warning rename to "Extreme" Heat
- Hard Freeze Watch and Warning removed

"What, Where, When, Impacts" (3W)

Winter Storm Watch

WHAT...Blizzard conditions possible. Winds gusting to 50 to 60 mph could cause whiteout conditions.

WHERE ... Plymouth County

WHEN...Until 8 PM EDT this evening.

<u>IMPACTS</u>...Travel could be dangerous. Wet snow and strong winds could result in power outages and tree damage.

Impact-Based Warnings (IBW)

Flash Flood Warning

HAZARD...Heavy rain producing flash flooding.

SOURCE...County officials and radar estimates.

<u>IMPACT</u>...The Howard 911 Center reported flooding on Main Street in Ellicott City. Please seek higher ground immediately.

FLASH FLOOD...RADAR INDICATED FLASH FLOOD DAMAGE THREAT...CONSIDERABLE Damage threat tags with WEA trigger for highest levels

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
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New Plain Language Headline Structure

SNOW: Hazardous travel in snow and blowing snow from 9AM to 8PM



HIGH SURF: Unusually high surf from 6AM to 12PM

FLOOD: Ponding of water in low-lying and poor drainage areas from 3PM to 8PM

STRONG THUNDERSTORM: Gusty winds and hail will impact XX county through 2PM

FIRE WEATHER CONDITIONS: Gusty winds will cause fires that are difficult to control from TIME 1 to TIME 2


BLOWING SNOW, ICE, WINTRY MIX, FREEZING FOG, COLD, FROST, POOR VISIBILITY, DUST, BLOWING DUST, ASHFALL, WIND, STAGNANT AIR, LAKE WIND, FREEZING SPRAY, HIGH WATER, LOW WATER, MARINE WEATHER, RIP CURRENTS, BEACH HAZARD














National Map Colors and Legend

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Updating Warnings with Warnings

Currently, NWS uses "Statement" products to update/expire/cancel short-fuse warnings.

Haz Simp will include a change to this practice:

- Follow-up information for these warnings will be issued using the same product (within the same PIL) as the initial warning.
- Use of the following Statements as update tools will be discontinued:
 - Severe Weather Statement (SVS) updates Tornado Warning, Severe Thunderstorm Warning, and Extreme Wind Warning
 - Flood Statement (FLS) updates the Flood Warning
 - Flash Flood Statement (FFS) updates the Flash Flood Warning
 - Marine Weather Statement (MWS) updates the Special Marine Warning

Example: A Tornado Warning follow-up will be issued as a TOR, not an SVS.

NOTE: This change will NOT impact the way Warnings and their updates go out on EAS and WEA.

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Benefits of Haz Simp Changes

Plain language:

- Removes the most confusing term from our alerting system
- Emphasizes the hazard and impact rather than a term puts the bottom line up front
- Easier to translate the plain language into other languages and dialects

Education: Emphasizes Watch and Warning terms and makes them easier to educate - it's either possible or happening

Consistency and Tracking:


- Improves machine readability, tracking, and consistency of information currently contained within the Special Weather Statement (SPS)
- Improves tracking of short-fused warning updates
