


PANEL OBJECTIVES

Fourth Geneva Convention, Article 18, 1949 (ratified by the U.S. in 1955)

- "...hospitals organized to give care to the wounded and sick, the infirm and maternity cases, may in no circumstances be the object of attack, but shall at all times be respected and protected by the Parties to the conflict."
